#### Message from the Vicar Canon Dr David J Kennedy

Thirteen hundred and fifty years ago, something remarkable began in the Tyne Valley. The great Saint Wilfrid, Bishop of York and later Bishop of Hexham, founded two monasteries. One of them we now know as Hexham Abbey and the second as Corbridge Parish Church, both of which Wilfrid dedicated to St Andrew the Apostle, one of the first disciples of Jesus.

Here in Corbridge, from 12tth October 2024 to the 12th October 2025 we are planning a wonderful year of events to mark this amazing anniversary. As well as celebrating St Andrew's set in the Market Place in the heart of our Village, we are also celebrating the community that has grown around it over the centuries and all that makes Corbridge such a special place today.

The Roman Arch at the west end of the Church also looks back to our origins as a Roman Town, a strategic crossing point on the Tyne, and major settlement serving Hadrian's Wall. Almost 2,000 years of history are woven into the fabric of our stunning Parish Church. Today, many people comment on its peacefulness, beauty and strong spiritual presence.

This brochure sets out some of the special events we are planning to mark our 1350<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. We invite you to be part of it, to celebrate this special year with us. The Church building is open every day, and there will be a series of exhibitions and events. You are also most welcome to join us for worship, as our doors are open for everyone. As well as celebrating the past, we hope that this year will inspire the future, as we look to our 1400<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2074! Younger members of our community will be here to see it.

#### Caporetto

A sculpted installation of bells by Keith Roberts

#### Thursday 8th May to Thursday 22nd May 2025



'Capretto' refers to a battle fought on the Italian front during the Autumn of 1917. These sculpted bells were part of a 2017 exhibition called 'War in the Sunshine'.

The artist has created a sculpture of broken and fractured bells to represent the chaos and upheaval hat war always brings. However, it does more than that Roberts' vision brings to the viewer the universal truth that the crises of war leave us broken and lost. His work provokes many questions.
