**Hymn:** 2 Christ, whose glory fills the skies

**Collect:** Almighty God, whose Son revealed in signs and miracles the wonder of your saving presence: renew your people with your heavenly grace, and in all our weakness sustain us by your mighty power; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

## **First reading:**

You stand assembled today, all of you, before the LORD your God-the leaders of your tribes, your elders, and your officials, all the men of Israel, <sup>11</sup> your children, your women, and the aliens who are in your camp, both those who cut your wood and those who draw your water — <sup>12</sup> to enter into the covenant of the LORD your God, sworn by an oath, which the LORD your God is making with you today; <sup>13</sup> in order that he may establish you today as his people, and that he may be your God, as he promised you and as he swore to your ancestors, to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob. <sup>14</sup>I am making this covenant, sworn by an oath, not only with you who stand here with us today before the LORD our God, <sup>15</sup> but also with those who are not here with us today.

## **Second Reading:**

<sup>31</sup> The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. <sup>32</sup> It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt-a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. <sup>33</sup> But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. <sup>34</sup> No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the LORD', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

# **Third Reading:** I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. <sup>2</sup>Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God-what is good and acceptable and perfect.

#### **Gospel reading:**

#### John 15. 1-10

'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. <sup>2</sup>He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. <sup>3</sup>You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. <sup>4</sup> Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. <sup>5</sup>I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. <sup>6</sup>Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. 7 If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. 8 My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. 9 As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. <sup>10</sup> If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. <sup>11</sup>I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. <sup>12</sup> 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup>No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. <sup>14</sup> You are my friends if you do what I command you. <sup>15</sup>I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father.

# 1350 UPDATE

We are cracking on with the organisation of a range of events which you will have seen in our **1350 Events Booklet.** This is in the process of being updated and will be re-issued very soon. Some highlights will be:

**MONTHLY DISPLAYS**: These will be situated in the South Transept. This month the display is about **SHOPS in Corbridge**. The information has come from the Heritage Centre and the display was created by Steve Betts. There will be further displays throughout the year.

**TALKS:** We now have Series of 6 talks planned. The first one will be given by David Waugh a well- known local historian, he will share his knowledge about *St Andrew's* 675 to 2025: *The First* 1350 Years.

**CAPORETTA:** This sculpted installation of bells by Keith Roberts will be on display from **Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May to Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2025**. It will begin with a launch evening on Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May.

**ART EXHIBITION**: There will be an exhibition by Helen Alice Johnson who lives and works between Alston in the North Pennines and Les Chapelles in the Pays de la Loire, Northern France. This exhibition is titled **OUR BEAUTIFUL WORLD** and will be in the North transept from  $5^{\text{th}}$  – $16^{\text{th}}$  June 2025.

**FLOWER FESTIVAL:** This will take place between 19<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> June. Running alongside this will be a cascade of knitted / crocheted flowers. If you would like to create some please take a pattern from the back of church.
