A Service of Thanksgiving to Celebrate the 1350th Anniversary of the Foundation of St Andrew's by Saint Wilfrid

The original building, most probably built of wood, is no longer in evidence. The Roman arch, the characteristic Norman carving above the door and the arch of the 12th century chancel still stand to bear witness to the passage of years and style.

The Saxon cross, perhaps once a roof finial, is still richly incised, despite the weathering it has faced. The shadows cast by these deeply carved forms echo the cross of St. Andrew, at the heart of the design and the life of the parish.

A door admits congregation and travellers to a place of worship, to celebrate, mourn, seek sanctuary and to support each other. The same door sends those people out into the world to share all the gifts St Andrew's has given them.

Welcome to St Andrew's Church, Corbridge on this wonderful Anniversary Sunday.

Today we rejoice that 1350 years ago, St Wilfrid, then Bishop of York, founded a monastery and Church here in Corbridge in close association with his founding of Hexham Abbey in 674AD.

Today we rejoice in the continuity of worship and witness here in the heart of Corbridge over all those centuries. We look forward to the year of services, events, and celebrations ahead of us.

Today we are delighted that our Bishop, The Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley, Bishop of Newcastle, is with us as we begin this anniversary year.

We welcome all our guests and visitors, including the Choir of Corbridge Church of England First School under the direction of the Executive Headteacher, Mrs Suzanne Hart.

We Hear God's Word

First Reading

1 Peter 2, 1-10

Rid yourselves, therefore, of all malice and all guile, insincerity, envy, and all slander. Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation— if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good.

Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 
